

#### **ACCESSIBLE EXPRESSIONS OHIO 2010**

Accessible Expressions Ohio is a statewide, juried, visual arts exhibition and tour adding to the richness of cultural diversity throughout Ohio. Since 1996 the program has provided professional development opportunities for artists to create, exhibit and sell their art, recognized all ability levels, and presents art by people with disabilities in inclusive settings.

Beginning September 1<sup>st</sup> of each year, artists are invited to respond to a call for entries with their artwork to VSA Ohio. Adjudicators determine which artwork will be featured in the show.

The artwork is exhibited at the opening ceremony and a second adjudication is conducted to determine the first, second and third place winners in youth, emerging, and professional categories, as well as Best in Show and People's Choice.

Following the opening ceremony, the artwork is divided into tours and travels around Ohio. Sales of artwork are encouraged at the opening ceremony as well as each tour site. This catalog includes all the art on tour.

VSA Ohio is a statewide service organization dedicated to empowering individuals with disabilities, creatively and inclusively, through the arts. VSA Ohio is a member of the international network of VSA, an affiliate of the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts. VSA is creating a society where people with disabilities learn through, participate in, and enjoy the arts. This program is made possible in part through funding from VSA, under and award from the U.S. Department of Education.

After the terrorist attacks on September 11, 2001, I had found myself caught in a vortex of chaos and confusion that had caused me to literally fall into a catatonic state artistically for almost four months, and was stricken with a bit of fear and anxiety that my artwork would be considered subversive, or at the very least, misunderstood because I explore, examine, and paint about topical socio-political/cultural issues and events. Artistically, this period in my life was the proverbial "darkest days of my life" because I felt I had lost my voice, my vehicle of expression.

Then in early 2002, I went to the Cleveland Museum of Art and visited their Medieval/Renaissance galleries and then a few months later left for my GCAC International Fellowship Residency to Dresden, Germany. Between these two experiences I had an epiphany; before that time I had not appreciated the artists or the artwork from these time periods, but on that day I had a Maslowian moment of self-actualization and began to understand and see beyond "just" the paint on canvas, the message of the artists and their artwork was revealed to me, so, armed with my new insight and understanding I found my voice, my vehicle to express myself again.

Additionally, it was a motivating factor that encouraged me to go back to college and earn an Associate's of Arts degree from Columbus State Community College (2006), B.A. in history of art from The Ohio State University (2007), and a Master of Library and Information Science (M.L.I.S.) degree with a focus in archival studies from Ken State University- Columbus campus (2009).





Once we began to question him on this, we discovered that he is actually doing this in real life – taking a female and a male of different kinds and putting them together in a pen until they mate to produce a hybrid duck. So his drawings are a record of actual experimentation. He then began to expand his artwork into different kinds of animals, putting a turtle and a lizard together to produce "lizrtle" and a rabbit and squirrel to produce" squabbit" and so forth.

I grew up in Bryan, and afterwards graduated from Bowling Green State University in 1983 in urban planning, where I took a black & white photography course. This class was my first formal training in art, and with the use of my dad's darkroom I was able to improve my photography skills. I was accepted in the Toledo Art Museum's Area Artist Exhibition for the first time in 1990 with a painting I created out of my head, and in 1991 I won my first prize, which was in photography.

Shortly after college I started on disability, and although I've had several part-time jobs, my income has been such that I've been limited in what I can do. Much of my photography has been taken on several vacations with my parents, and I subsequently fell in love with the America "n West and northern plains. In 2000 I entered the Black Swamp Arts Festival in Bowling Green, and with the help of my parents participated in the show annually through 2008. I was awarded Best of Show in 2003 at the Findlay Festival of the Arts, for my photography of Ukrainan and Ortodox churches, specifically those in Manitoba just north of the US border.

In 2004 I was able to get permission to paint from the photographs in a book on the Ukrainian churches of Manitoba, and last year I received permission from two more publishers of Canada's Ukrainian and eastern Europeon churches. These subjects are the driving force of my art, with the landscapes I've created to go with them. I am also able to make up paintings completely from my head, which is an asset because I'm no longer able to travel as in past years. The grain elevator painting I am entering in this show is such a painting, inspired by an elevator we were not able to stop at on our last trip to the western Dakotas in 2003. I'm hoping to continue to improve my painting, and if I am able, to travel to the upper midwest to photograph churches and the landscape again. For now, photographing the Ukrainian churches of the Canadian prairie provinces is a dream that is out of reach.

Besides the arts, some other interests include astrology, symbolism, holistic health, shamanism, geology, experiencing nature, walking, and Native American Spirituality. I'm presently studying the Native American flute and have just gotten a certification in guided imagery.

Some of his collections include: Noah's Ark, nursery rhymes and fairy tales, Red Hat Ladies, Last Supper, Global Chess Games, Cyclonauts, carnivals and space scenes.

At the heart of me will always be an Architect. But my path took a strange and difficult turn and I was severed from my profession just as construction began on my last building for the Frost Art Museum in Miami. Little did I know at the time that a journey paralleling Art Therapy would lead me to making art as my path to creative liberation. I have a disease of the spine known as Scheuermann's Kyphosis, a form of scoliosis where the spine curves forward. Over the years my curvature worsened to the point that surgery was required.

After a second surgery, feeling marooned while lying in a hospital bed and falling deeper into despair, my life partner encouraged me to try and create art on the computer during the limited time I could sit upright. I began teaching myself Photoshop so that I could have an outlet for my pent-up creativity. This was the beginning of an odyssey of self awareness and personal expression that continues in my work today. The ability to do my art is my refuge and personal oasis. In this place anything is possible. When I began learning Photoshop I was able to express both the pent-up feelings going on inside my head and the healing process happening inside my body. I also gained a sense of confidence and empowerment. As my work evolved I began to explore many world influences and interests, including Islamic art, African art, Aboriginal art and textile traditions from different cultures around the world to name a few.

I also began creating creatures of my imagination I call WHIMSIES: carefree and unencumbered beings free of the constraints of gravity. They are symbols representing standins for me. They move freely in ways that I'm not able to. My mind is able to soar through them, yet I'm just sitting in a chair at a computer moving my hand ever so delicately around. Much of these whimsy works are about motion, speed and the immediacy of being in the moment.

This notion of being in the immediacy of the moment has helped me create my newest series of works that explore the deep primal recesses of the mind's imagination merging with technology and intuitive mathematics. They are worked out in my mind when I'm in too much pain and unable to sit at the computer, often when I'm in a dream like state from taking pain medications. It's like a puzzle construct in my head that I then make myself figure out. I then sit at the computer and the process of using my mind to make the dream in my mind a reality begins to take me away from it all.




